Vermont Hospitals Are Already Subject to Financial Audits

For example, some of the concerns raised by the GMCB about the flow of funds between the UVMHN's VT and NY hospitals were informed by their financial audits

Clarify What the Committee Wants to Learn from an Audit

Example: Whether NY hospitals within the UVMHN are experiencing losses, and if so, the extent to which these losses are being subsidized by VT payers and/or VT hospitals in the UVMHN?

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Access to Records May be a Barrier to Answering the Committee's Questions

1. The GMCB may not be able to get records from the UVMHN under current law. Additionally, it is not clear what records could be attained from UVMHN's NY hospitals.

Access to Records May be a Barrier to Answering the Committee's Questions

2. If the GMCB contracts with the Auditor's Office or a private firm the records access issue remains.

Regulatory Reach of GMCB Re: Health Networks

Appears GMCB doesn't have direct regulatory powers over instate health networks, though it does over the in-state hospitals that are part of the in-state network

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Examples of Legal/Regulatory Questions

- Does Vermont law allow GMCB to regulate UVMHN?
- Does Vermont law limit/prohibit losses generated in NY hospitals from impacting the cost of care at the Vermont UVMHN hospitals?
- ❖ Does Vermont law prohibit the transfer of assets from Vermont hospitals to NY hospitals via the UVMHN?
