Some Quick Facts on our Licensed Assisted Living Communities

Cathedral Square Assisted Living:

- 30 apartments (reduced from 38 in 2021)
- 20 residents are Nursing Home level of Care (ERC), 1 basic care (ACCS)
- 302 people on waitlist 3-5 year average wait.
- Majority rely on Medicaid to pay for care

Memory Care at Allen Brook

- ○14 apartments
- 11 residents are Nursing Home Level of Care (ERC), 1 basic level (ACCS)
- 118 people on waitlist- 3-5 year average wait
- 0100% of residents rely on Medicaid to pay for care

We Fully Support H.13!

- We need higher rates of Medicaid Reimbursement to provide the needed care to our residents.
- We need predictability in payment. Costs increase every year and we need to be able to budget accordingly.
- The DVHA Rate Study is already out of date (two years old).
- We need more Medicaid slots for Vermonters yet we are seeing closures over time in both Residential Care and Assisted Living Communities.
- We need the entire continuum of long-term care options in our communities so that we are providing cost-effective and consumer preference options and there is access to the right level of care when it is needed.
