Re: H. 238, PFAS in Consumer Products

Dear Chair Lyons, Vice Chair Weeks and Members of the Committee:

The American Coatings Association (ACA)<sup>1</sup> appreciates the opportunity to briefly comment regarding H. 238, *PFAS in Consumer Products*, and the definition of *fluorine treated container* therein. The Association's membership represents 90% of the paint and coatings industry. Our membership includes companies that manufacture paint, coatings, sealants and adhesives.

Although ACA members do not typically distribute products in containers incorporating fluorine or "PFAS," we would like the committee to note that the definition of fluorine treated container is circular and vague, as noted below:

Fluorine treated container means a fluorinated treated plastic container. (H. 238, Section 1(8), April 25, 2025 draft)

In contrast, the definition being proposed in Maine provides a more detailed description:

"Fluorinated container" means any container which has been treated with fluorine atoms to create a permanent barrier or coating.

(Maine Department of Environmental Protection, *Ch. 90 Products Containing PFAS*, draft rules)

The proposed definition in Maine better aligns with the intent of Vermont's H. 238 by identifying intentionally added PFAS that serves a functional purpose in the fluorine treated container.
