Workplace Violence Cost Impacts

In the United States, the annual turnover rate of nurses is estimated to be between 15% to 36% due to workplace violence.

Replacing a nurse costs approximately \$88,000 per nurse.



Workplace Violence Prevention Cost Impacts

U.S. hospitals spend about \$847 million each year on workplace violence prevention efforts.




Impact on Patients

 Workplace violence perpetrated on health care workers impacts patients, with self-reported delays or omissions in testing, increases in post-operative complications, higher perceived adverse events and decreased patient safety.



Workplace Violence Labor Impact in Vermont



Vermont has the highest rate of individuals with days away from work, job restriction, or transfer due to workplace violence at 7.8 per 10,000 workers
