Subject: Health; hospitals; service reductions; Agency of Human Services;

Green Mountain Care Board

Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to require a hospital to provide notice and opportunity to comment and to receive approval from the Agency of Human Services prior to reducing or eliminating any hospital services. It would also require the Agency to report any approved service reductions or eliminations to the Green Mountain Care Board to allow the Board to make appropriate adjustments to the hospital's budget.

An act relating to an approval process for reducing or eliminating hospital services

It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

Sec. 1. 18 V.S.A. § 9405d is added to read:

§ 9405d. HOSPITAL SERVICE REDUCTIONS; APPROVAL REQUIRED

(a) A hospital shall not reduce or eliminate any service without approval from the Secretary of Human Services as set forth in this section.

1       **(b) A hospital that proposes to reduce or eliminate a service shall:**

2               **(1) Provide a notice of intent to the Agency of Human Services, the**  
3       **Green Mountain Care Board, the Office of the Health Care Advocate, and the**  
4       **members of the General Assembly who represent the hospital service area not**  
5       **less than 60 days prior to the proposed reduction or elimination. The notice**  
6       **shall explain the rationale for the proposed reduction or elimination and**  
7       **describe how it is consistent with the Statewide Health Care Delivery Strategic**  
8       **Plan, once established, and the hospital's most recent community health needs**  
9       **assessment conducted pursuant to section 9405a of this title and 26 U.S.C.**  
10       **§ 501(r)(3).**

11               **(2) Post the notice of intent on the hospital's website beginning on or**  
12       **before the day on which the notice is provided pursuant to subdivision (1) of**  
13       **this subsection.**

14               **(3) Publish the notice in a newspaper of general circulation in the**  
15       **hospital service area within 10 days after notice is provided pursuant to**  
16       **subdivision (1) of this subsection.**

17               **(4) Conduct a public engagement process, including holding one or**  
18       **more public hearings in the county in which the hospital is located and**  
19       **soliciting and responding to public comments, regarding the proposed service**  
20       **reduction or elimination. The public engagement process may begin prior to**  
21       **providing the notice required by subdivision (1) of this subsection and shall**

1 continue for not less than 30 days following the notice. The hospital shall  
2 provide a summary of the community's response to the proposal, including the  
3 public comments received, to the Agency of Human Services weekly during  
4 the public engagement process.

5 (c)(1) The Agency of Human Services shall review the proposed service  
6 reduction or elimination for consistency with the Statewide Health Care  
7 Delivery Strategic Plan, once established, and the community health needs  
8 assessment, and shall consider the community's response and the impact of the  
9 proposal on access to necessary care and services in the hospital service area.

10 (2) The Agency may approve the proposal if the Agency determines that  
11 the proposed service reduction or elimination is not inconsistent with the  
12 Statewide Health Care Delivery Strategic Plan, once established, or the  
13 community health needs assessment; that the proposal does not unduly burden  
14 access to necessary care and services; and that the advantages of the proposal  
15 outweigh any disadvantages.

16 (d) If the Agency approves a service reduction or elimination pursuant to  
17 this section, the Agency shall notify the Green Mountain Care Board within  
18 five business days to enable the Board to review the impact on the hospital's  
19 budget pursuant to subdivision 9456(e)(2) of this title.

## § 9456. BUDGET REVIEW

(e)(1) The Board, in consultation with the Vermont Program for Quality in Health Care, shall utilize mechanisms to measure hospital costs, quality, and access and alignment with the Statewide Health Care Delivery Strategic Plan, once established.

~~(B) The notice shall explain the rationale for the proposed reduction or elimination and describe how it is consistent with the Statewide Health Care Delivery Strategic Plan, once established, and the hospital's most recent community health needs assessment conducted pursuant to section 9405a of this title and 26 U.S.C. § 501(r)(3).~~

4 ~~(D) A service that has been identified for reduction or elimination in~~

7 ~~not need to comply with subdivisions (A)–(C) of this subdivision (c)(2).~~

8 Upon receipt of notification by the Agency of Human Services that it  
9 approved a hospital's reduction or elimination of services pursuant to section  
10 9405d of this title, the Board shall review the impact of the reduction or  
11 elimination on the hospital's approved budget. The Board may adjust the  
12 hospital's budget as necessary to reflect the elimination or reduction, which  
13 may include directing that any savings related to the reduction or elimination  
14 are returned to payers and Vermonters to address affordability concerns or are  
15 reinvested in primary care, prevention, and other community-based services.

16 (3) The Board, in collaboration with the Department of Financial  
17 Regulation, shall monitor the implementation of any authorized ~~decrease~~  
18 reduction in or elimination of hospital services to determine its benefits to  
19 Vermonters or to Vermont's health care system, or both.
