
Crosswalk of Proposed Future of Regulation of Accountable Care Organizations in Vermont

| CERTIFICATION | |
| All ACOs contracting with Vermont Medicaid and/or private Vermont payers are subject to a one-time certification process, annual certification eligibility verification in the following years, and can be de-certified at any time Medicare-only ACOs (ACOs that contract with Medicare only) are not currently subject to certification | All ACOs, regardless of contracted payers, are subject to a one-time certification process, annual certification eligibility verification in the following years, and can be de-certified at any time |
| BUDGET REVIEW | |
| All ACOs, regardless of contracted payers, are subject to an annual budget review process | All ACOs contracting with Vermont Medicaid and/or private Vermont payers are subject to an annual budget review process Medicare-Only ACOs would not be subject to a budget review |
| SIZE/SCOPE of ACOs | |
| ACOs with 10,000 or more Vermont lives are subject to a budget review against the full set of statutory criteria, while ACOs with fewer than 10,000 lives may have their budgets reviewed under a selected subset of criteria depending on the type and nature of the ACO. | Number of lives is irrelevant to the applied certification and budget review criteria GMCB would have authority to implement expedited certification rules for Medicare-Only ACOs due to some oversight from CMS; a subset of criteria may be applied |
| ACO REVIEW | |
| For FY25 the GMCB anticipates reviewed the budgets of four ACOs and verified the eligibility of certification for one ACO | If the proposed statute were currently in place, the GMCB be certifying three ACOs (should no further change in ACOs in Vermont occur for 2026) |
| STATUTORY LANGUAGE | |
| Statutory language informing the GMCB's budget review process and certification requirements for ACOs includes All-Payer ACO Model-specific requirements to ensure the alignment of regulation and model goals | Granular APM-specific language has been removed from the statute and replaced with more general language intended to be agnostic to Vermont's next health care reform efforts |
