

1 TO THE HONORABLE SENATE:

2 The Committee on Health and Welfare to which was referred Senate  
3 Resolution No. 16 entitled “Senate resolution opposing recent federal actions  
4 that threaten public health and urging their swift reversal” respectfully reports  
5 that it has considered the same and recommends that the resolution be  
6 amended by striking out all after the title and inserting in lieu thereof the  
7 following:

8 *Whereas*, on January 20, 2025, President Donald J. Trump issued an  
9 Executive Order to withdraw the United States from the World Health  
10 Organization (WHO), a move that may jeopardize the health and well-being of  
11 Vermonters, other Americans, and individuals all around the world because of  
12 the WHO’s focus on improving public health and on detecting, preventing, and  
13 responding to health emergencies, including disease outbreaks that do not  
14 respect state lines or international borders, and

15 *Whereas*, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services is eliminating  
16 the jobs of approximately 20,000 employees, including at the Centers for  
17 Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), where teams were cut whose work  
18 focused on preventing injuries and violence from causes including motor  
19 vehicle crashes, child maltreatment, and traumatic brain injury; on tracking  
20 trends in mental health and substance use disorders; on rape prevention and  
21 education; on maternal mortality and maternal and child health; and on many

1 other areas affecting public health in Vermont, the United States, and beyond,  
2 and

3 *Whereas*, the Trump Administration has eliminated the entire management  
4 and regulations divisions at the Center for Tobacco Products in the Food and  
5 Drug Administration and cut most of the staff at the Office on Smoking and  
6 Health at the CDC, which severely hampers tobacco regulation and  
7 enforcement efforts and will have a negative impact on tobacco prevention in  
8 Vermont’s youth and on Vermonters’ public health, and

9 *Whereas*, the National Institutes of Health, a part of the U.S. Department of  
10 Health and Human Services that describes itself as “the nation’s medical  
11 research agency — making important discoveries that improve health and save  
12 lives,” is now refusing to award grant funds to universities that operate any  
13 programs that advance or promote diversity, equity, and inclusion, which  
14 jeopardizes the future of medical research and disregards the existence of  
15 health inequities, and

16 *Whereas*, the U.S. Department of Education cut approximately  
17 \$1 billion in federal grants that support critical mental health services in  
18 schools, which will dramatically reduce access to these services and threatens  
19 the health and well-being of youth around the country, and

***Resolved by the Senate:***

**Resolved:** That the Secretary of the Senate be directed to send a copy of this resolution to President Donald J. Trump, Secretary of Health and Human Services Robert F. Kennedy Jr., and the Vermont Congressional Delegation.
