"Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) is a policy approach that assigns producers responsibility for the end-of-life of products.

This can include both financial responsibility and operational responsibility, though the amount and type may differ. Producers are required to provide funding and/or services that assist in managing covered products after the use phase."


- State run Vermont E-Cycles Program


