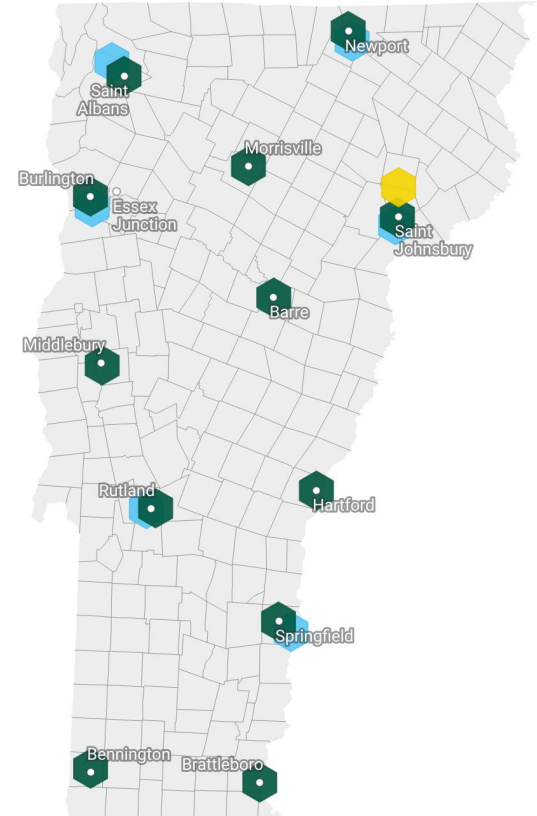
Non-driver Identification Cards

Overview

- Housed within Vermont **Agency of Human Services**
- **Unified System**
 - Pretrial supervision → detained → sentenced → community supervision
- **Facilities:**
 - 6 in-state facilities
 - 5 men's facilities
 - 1 women's facility
 - 1 out-of-state men's facility
- **Probation & Parole:**
 - 12 district offices
- Staff: **1,100+**

DOC Population



Incarcerated/Supervised Population (as of 1/27/26)

- **1668** total incarcerated
 - 652 detained
 - 1016 sentenced
- **4746** under community supervision
 - 3867 on probation

Obtaining Non-Driver Identification



Sentencing

An individual with a qualifying sentence (6 months or more to serve) becomes eligible to obtain a non-driver identification card prior to release from a correctional facility

Reentry Planning

During reentry planning, an individual's case worker will ask if they need an ID upon release

ID Application

If the individual answers 'yes', they will fill out an application and a specialist at DOC's Central Office submits it on their behalf. An address is required to obtain an ID

Processing/Obtaining

After 3-4 weeks of processing time, the identification will get sent to DOC's Central Office. DOC then distributes to the appropriate field site or facility

Non-Driver Identification/Releases in Volume



- In 2025:
 - 6070 total releases from DOC custody
 - 4567 unique individuals
 - 1237 sentenced individuals
 - 2,468 detained individuals
- In FY24-25:
 - 465 non-driver IDs provided to sentenced individuals
- In FY25-26:
 - 182 non-driver IDs provided to sentenced individuals (so far)

Pathways for Detainees at Six Months



- There are various potential pathways for detainees once they have been incarcerated for six months, ie.:
 - Sentenced and immediately released for time served
 - Charges dropped
 - Posting bail/bail amended
 - Sentenced to immediate probation
 - Stay detained for indeterminate amount of time before sentencing
