of the STATE OF VERMONT BIENNIAL SESSION, 2013

WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 9, 2013

Pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and the laws of the State of Vermont, the Senate convened at the State House at Montpelier, on the first Wednesday, after the first Monday, the ninth day of January in the year of two thousand thirteen.

At ten o'clock in the forenoon, eastern standard time, the Senate was called to order by the President, Lieutenant Governor Philip B. Scott.

Incoming President Takes Oath of Office

Senator Baruth moved that the President *pro tempore* appoint a Committee of two Senators to wait upon His Excellency, Philip B. Scott, Lieutenant Governor-elect, and escort him to the bar of the Senate.

The Committee appointed to wait upon His Excellency, Philip B. Scott, Lieutenant Governor-elect, performed the duties assigned to it and appeared at the bar of the Senate accompanied by His Excellency, Philip B. Scott, who took and subscribed the oath of office required by the Constitution from Senator Richard T. Mazza, long-time friend and colleague of the Lieutenant Governor.

Remarks of Incoming Lieutenant Governor Philip B. Scott Journalized

Thereupon, the incoming President addressed the Senate, assuring his full cooperation and accommodation on a nonpartisan and objective basis, and, on motion of Senator Campbell, his remarks were ordered entered in the Journal, and are as follows:

Remarks delivered by Lieutenant Governor Philip B. Scott to the Vermont State Senate, after taking the oath of office on January 10, 2013:

“Good morning. First, I’d like to thank Vermonters for the opportunity to serve the state for another two years. It truly is an honor for me to serve as Vermont’s Lt. Governor. To think a Barre-born stock car racer like myself would ever have an opportunity such as this is truly incredible.

“I also want to thank my family for their support.

“And I’d like to welcome our freshman class. We have 5 “new faces” in the chamber: Chris Bray, Don Collins, Norm McAllister, John Rodgers, and David Zuckerman. None of their faces are truly “new,” but we welcome them back in a new capacity. We do, after all, in true Vermont fashion, like to recycle. And to the rest of you: My sincere congratulations, and welcome back to each and every one of you.

“This session offers us an interesting mix of fresh perspective and experience. We have a returning Governor, Pro Tem, Senate Secretary and Lieutenant Governor – these are all things we didn’t have last time around. (This time, we may actually know what we’re doing! Or at least, give that appearance.)

“The expectations for elected officials, at all levels, are higher than they’ve ever been. Last week, on a national level, we went right to the edge during the Fiscal Cliff standoff, which showed us the danger of political brinksmanship – something that I hope we can all remember in this chamber when those seemingly polarizing issues arise. My belief has always been that if you put

aside the ego and the rhetoric, and inject a bit of creativity, fairness and common sense, that almost any problem involving money can be solved.

“While campaigning, a recurring message I heard, and I’m sure many of you heard, was the anxiety over affordability. The margins are getting smaller. And with the recent 2% rise in the Social Security tax, disposable income has shrunk for all of us in the workforce.

“Another problem we face is the exodus of our young professionals. According to state census data, our 25-to-44 age group lost 30% of its population in the last decade. That’s 28,000 Vermonters who left our state and took with them their buying power, their innovation, and their children. Many of our elementary school classrooms echo with their absence.

“We also struggle in this building with a state budget “pie” that seems to get smaller and smaller each year, much like the pies in Mazza’s Store, which, oddly enough, still cost just as much.

“The question is, what do we do about it?”

“I’ve been in business for almost 30 years, and as in any business, there are two sides to the balance sheet: expenses and revenues. We have the same thing here in state government, so we have choices: We can reduce expenses by cutting staff and programs, or we can increase revenues by raising taxes and fees. And, for better or for worse, we’ve already done both. What I continue to hear all over the state is that Vermonters are feeling frustrated, tapped out, and taxed out. The Governor has said the same, and I suspect many of you have gotten that same feedback.

“But there is another way to hit both sides of that balance sheet at the same time. And that’s by growing our economy. If we can work with businesses, both small and large, to replenish those private-sector jobs, progress and prosperity will come. If we can entice young professionals to move here, our classrooms will fill up again, and so will our vacant storefronts, and so will our state coffers.

“But we need more tools to entice people here than just our incredible quality of life. We’re all familiar with the Tourism and Marketing survey completed last year that asked Americans what they associate with the word “Vermont.” Along with “beautiful unspoiled mountains,” we need people to think “opportunity.”

“Our ability to make this happen can be surprisingly easy, if we put aside the temptation to score political points at the expense of Vermonters, who are counting on us to solve our very real problems.

“I’ve talked to a number of you over the last several weeks about coming together around this “theme” of Growing Vermont’s Economy. I only ask you to please keep this goal in mind as you consider the bills that come through each of your committees. Ask yourselves questions like: What will this bill do to help our economy? Will this bill make it easier for families to live and prosper in Vermont? Does this help or hurt our balance sheet?

“Of course, there will always be issues that don’t fit into a neat little box, and whose impact can’t be measured in dollars: whether it’s the most compassionate way to handle end-of-life care, or the best way to integrate migrant workers into our society. These might not be the questions we want to think about, but they are the ones before us. We will each have our own, sometimes very personal and deeply-held beliefs about these issues. And we will not always agree. But we have a choice. We can make those inevitable disagreements into divisions, or we can commit to respectful and reasonable debates, not only with each other, but with the citizens of Vermont. Never forget that we are just caretakers here in this beautiful building, which belongs to the citizens of Vermont.

“Voters on November 6th sent us here with an enormous responsibility resting on our shoulders. But with all of us pulling in the same direction, and treating each other with respect and civility, I think there is a lot of potential for what we can accomplish together in the next two years.

“My door is always open. I, along with my chief of staff, Nancy, look forward to working with all of you. Thank you.”

Since the election I have struggled about my future in the Senate. As you know I have had a significant back problem for a number of years, a condition that was aggravated when I fractured my ankle in 2010. For the past two years, I have undergone surgery, intensive therapy, and rehabilitation that I strongly believed would have allowed me to return to my duties in the Senate for the 2013-2014 legislative session.

As time has passed my condition remains the same. After consulting with my physicians and family over the past several weeks I have concluded that

my return to the Senate would come with physical limitations that would prevent me from fully discharging my duties representing my constituents, my county, and my state.

It is impossible to express how great a privilege and honor it has been to have represented the people of Rutland County. It has been a highlight of my life.

I want to thank you for your friendship, support, and leadership. It has been wonderful working with you and my Senate colleagues. I will miss that closeness.

Whereas, on January 22, 1973, the U.S. Supreme Court decision in *Roe v. Wade*, 410 U.S. 113 (1973), established that the U.S. Constitution protects a woman's right to privacy and limits government interference with medical decisions, and

Whereas, the Senate believes that the decision in *Roe v. Wade* ensures that abortion remains a safe and legal procedure for a woman to consider, if and when she needs it, and

Whereas, as the State of Vermont pursues major health care reform, it should be a public policy goal to enhance the health of all citizens, including women of all ages, and to strengthen individuals and families by encouraging and promoting access to comprehensive family planning services and to prenatal support services that help ensure that planned pregnancies remain healthy throughout their entire term, and

Whereas, the General Assembly's repeal of the dated and restrictive 13 V.S.A. Whereas, the names of those buried there have been gathered in the past, and may still be able to be located and preserved so that these individuals will not be left unknown, and

Whereas, there is evidence that at least two and perhaps more patients from the Vermont State Hospital were buried at different locations on the grounds in unmarked graves that are likely to never be identified which would be a grievous indication of past indifference to the lives of these individuals, a practice that should never again be permitted to occur in this state, now therefore be it

Whereas, in 1999 the election of three trustees of the University of Vermont and State Agricultural College was decided by majority vote, which required a total of eight ballots, and

Whereas, in 2001 and subsequent bienniums the elections of three trustees of the University of Vermont and State Agricultural College were decided by plurality vote, each of which required one ballot only, and

Whereas, if an election for multiple vacancies is to be decided by a plurality vote, then a great savings of time can be effectuated, *now therefore be it*

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives:

That, notwithstanding the current provisions of Joint Rule 10, and for this election only, the election of three trustees of the University of Vermont and State Agricultural College at a Joint Assembly to be held on February 21, 2013, shall be governed by the following procedure:

(1) All candidates for the office of Trustee shall be voted upon and decided on the same ballot; members may vote for any number of candidates up to and including the maximum number of vacancies to be filled, which in this case shall be three.

(2) The three candidates receiving the most votes shall be declared elected to fill the three vacancies.

(3) In the event that the first balloting for the Trustee vacancies results in a tie vote for one or more of the three vacant positions, then voting shall continue on successive ballots until the vacancies have been filled, again by election declared of those candidates receiving the most votes.

Whereas, the Third Battle of Winchester was the first major battle of the campaign that resulted in Union control of the Shenandoah Valley, and

Whereas, Colonel Stephen Thomas told his Eighth Vermont Regiment to “remember Ethan Allen and Old Vermont” as he ordered the bayonet charge so important to victory at Winchester, and

Whereas, on September 19, 1885, the 21st anniversary of the battle, veterans of the Eighth Vermont Regiment dedicated a monument, which Herbert Hill constructed on the Winchester battlefield, overlooking the scene of the bayonet charge, and

Whereas, Virginians joined the Vermont veterans in the celebration at the dedication, and

Whereas, the General Assembly, in a resolution adopted in 1886, praised the “kindly spirit in which the inhabitants of the Shenandoah Valley received the citizens of this State, September 19, 1885,” and

Whereas, subsequently, the Eighth Vermont Monument was removed from the battlefield to the Winchester National Cemetery, and

Whereas, with the approach of the Battle of Winchester’s 150th anniversary, the General Assembly wishes to return the Eighth Vermont Monument to the battlefield at a site as close as possible to the original location where our veterans of the battle had placed it, *now therefore be it*

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives:

That the Vermont General Assembly respectfully asks the Vermont Congressional Delegation, the National Park Service, the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, the Civil War Trust, and the City of Winchester, Virginia to facilitate the return of the Eighth Vermont Monument to the hallowed ground of the Winchester battlefield in a timely fashion to enable the rededication of the monument to occur on the battle’s 150th anniversary, September 19, 2014, *and be it further*
