The Office of Legislative Council is seeking to hire an attorney to provide legal research and analysis, legislative drafting, policy analysis, and other legal services to the Vermont General Assembly. The Office of Legislative Council is a nonpartisan office that provides legal support to all members of the General Assembly, regardless of party or political affiliation.

The attorney will handle natural resources, Act 250, land use, energy issues, and other topics as workload permits.

Applicants must have superior research, analysis, and writing skills, good interpersonal skills, the ability to perform at the highest level under pressure, and the intellectual curiosity to learn new areas of the law as needed. A strong work ethic and the ability always to remain professional and impartial while working in a political environment are essential. Legal work experience in the subject areas noted above or in legislative drafting, or both, is strongly preferred. Admission to the Vermont Bar within a reasonable time of hiring is required.
