

2024 GENERAL ELECTION: CHANGES IN LEGISLATIVE MEMBERSHIP

Introduction

The 2024 General Election resulted in 50 new members of the House of Representatives—one-third of its 150 members—which tied the records set in the previous 2022 General Election and in the 1972 General Election as the largest turnovers since the House had 150 members (1966). Three House standing committee chairs from the 2023–24 Biennium did not return to the House in 2025–26.¹ And that followed the nine House standing committee chairs from the 2021–22 Biennium who did not return in 2023–24.

The Senate also had a large turnover as a result of the 2024 General Election: Nine new Senators, or nearly one-third of its 30 members. And that followed the 2022 General Election, which did result in a full one-third turnover with 10 new Senators. Six Senate standing committee chairs from the 2023–24 Biennium did not return to the Senate in 2025–26.² And that followed the four Senate standing committee chairs from the 2021–22 Biennium who did not return in 2023–24.

The 2024 General Election also resulted in significant changes in political affiliation in both chambers. In the House, majority party membership decreased from 105 members in 2023–24 to 87 in 2025–26. And in the Senate, majority party membership decreased from 22 members in 2023–24 to 16 in 2025–26.

Not all of the “new” members in the 2025–26 General Assembly are brand new to legislative service. Six new members of the 2025–26 House served in a prior House biennium. And four new members of the 2025–26 Senate were members of the House in the 2023–24 Biennium.

What follows are lists providing an overview of membership changes in both chambers. Thereafter, this document provides the full membership lists of the House and Senate for the 2025–26 Biennium.
