¹ The Governor vetoed the 2023 appropriations bill H.494 on May 27, 2023. The Legislature met on June 20, 2023 and having at least a two-thirds majority in favor of the bill in each chamber, the bill was passed, overriding the Governor's veto.

² In 2020 the Budget was divided into two parts because of uncertainty surrounding COVID-19 funding from the federal government and the State's fiscal/economic complications due to the Pandemic. The first portion of the Budget was signed by the Governor on 6/30/2020, but the legislature did not adjourn until 9/25/2020, which was the same day the second portion of the budget was passed by the Legislature.

³ The Governor vetoed 2018 appropriations bill H.924 on May 29. A special session was called, and among the bills introduced and passed was a new version of the appropriations bill, H.16, which was introduced on June 19, passed by both the House and Senate on June 25, and allowed to become law without the Governor's signature.

⁴ In 2017, the Governor vetoed the appropriations bill H. 518. A veto session was held on June 21, 2017, whereby the veto of the Governor was sustained and a new appropriations bill (H.542) was introduced by the House appropriations committee and passed by the House and Senate on the same day.
