No. 140. An act relating to miscellaneous health care provisions

### Sec. 4. MENTAL HEALTH INTEGRATION COUNCIL; REPORT

Creation. There is created the Mental Health Integration Council for the purpose of helping to ensure that all sectors of the health care system actively participate in the State's principles for mental health integration established pursuant to 18 V.S.A. § 7251(4) and (8) and as envisioned in the Department of Mental Health's 2020 report "Vision 2030: A 10-Year Plan for an Integrated and Holistic System of Care."

On or before December 15, 2021, the Commissioners of Mental Health and of Health shall report on the Council's progress to the Joint Health Reform Oversight Committee.

### The Council shall address the integration of mental health in the health care system, including:

- 1. identifying obstacles to the full integration of mental health into a holistic health care system and identifying means of overcoming those barriers;
- 2. helping to ensure the implementation of existing law to establish full integration within each member of the Council's area of expertise;
- 3. establishing commitments from non-state entities to adopt practices and implementation tools that further integration;
- 4. proposing legislation where current statute is either inadequate to achieve full integration or where it creates barriers to achieving the principles of integration; and
- 5. fulfilling any other duties the Council deems necessary to achieve its objectives.

# The Council may create subcommittees comprising the Council's members for the purpose of carrying out the Council's charge.

The Commissioner of Mental Health shall call the first meeting of the Council.

(2) The Commissioner of Mental Health shall serve as chair. The Commissioner of Health shall serve as vice chair.

- (3) The Council shall meet every other month between January 15, 2021 and January 1, 2023.
- (4) The Council shall cease to exist on July 30, 2023.

On or before December 15, 2021, the Commissioners of Mental Health and of Health shall report on the Council's progress to the Joint Health Reform Oversight Committee.

On or before January 15, 2023, the Council shall submit a final written report to the House Committee on Health Care and to the Senate Committee on Health and Welfare with its findings and any recommendations for legislative action, including a recommendation as to whether the term of the Council should be extended.

This memo serves as the report summarizing the Council's progress to date.

The Mental Health Integration Council has met three times; July 13, September 14, and November 9, and has regular meetings scheduled every other month, as required by statute, through July of 2023. The members of the Council are listed in Appendix A.

In addition to the meetings of the full Council, four workgroups – Primary Care, Pediatric Care, Funding & Alignment of Performance Measures, and Workforce Development – meet regularly (membership are also listed in Appendix A). All workgroups are using Results Based Accountability to frame their work. This will help the workgroups create a roadmap for progress and provide a standardized method for reporting on work.

The workgroups are tasked with identifying opportunities to further integration work that is underway, or to create a new initiative if necessary, but in all cases they are focused on establishing "full integration within each member of the Council's area of expertise," as required in the statute. Similarly, the meetings are designed to build relationships and create networks which will facilitate establishing commitments from all stakeholders to adopt practices and implementation tools that further integration.

While these workgroups may choose to continue into the second year of the Council's mandate, a second set of workgroups will begin work in July of 2022. Those workgroups are currently envisioned as Specialty Care, Prevention & Wellness, Communications & Data Sharing, and Implicit Bias & Health Equity Work.

To best facilitate the culture change that must underlie changes in practice, the Department of Mental Health has contracted with an independent consultant experienced in guiding large organizational change initiatives. A Department of Mental Health (Department) staff member works in close partnership with the consultant to design each Council meeting and meet with the workgroup facilitators to coordinate strategy across groups. The Integration of Pediatric Care workgroup has been unable to recruit a co-facilitator, so the Department contracted with Global Learning Partners to provide facilitation and planning.

The Council has heard about progress on integration in the federal Veteran's Administration and the Blueprint for Health. Members have workshopped care scenarios and discussed how their respective fields of expertise can resolve gaps in care and prevention, looking beyond the individual patient/client to the person's home needs and supports as well as their community supports.

At the January meeting of the Council, the CEO of one Federally Qualified Healthcare Center in Vermont and one Designated Agency that is in the process of implementing the federal Certified Community Behavioral Health Center will present on their respective models. Council members will then break into small groups for facilitated discussions about the models. The entire Council will also hear updates from each of the workgroups.
